Leopard beaten to death

Villagers beat a leopard to death after it attacked eight people in Nilphamari's Kishoreganj upazila on Monday. Purnima Rani, 40, of Basunia Para village of Bahagli union under Kishoreganj upazila was collecting bamboo leaves when the leopard attacked her. Hearing her screams, villagers rushed to her aid and attacked the leopard with sharp weapons. During the confrontation the leopard injured six other people, including Mintoo, Abbas, Mazed, Rahmat, Heda and Mohabbat. Mojnu, 28, then grabbed the leopard and a fierce fight between man and beast ensued. The leopard bit Mojnu repeatedly, causing serious injuries. A crowd of villagers then intervened with sharp weapons to save Mojnu's life and killed the leopard. One injured person is in a critical condition at Rangpur Medical College Hospital and three others have been admitted to Kishoreganj Upazila Health Complex. The remaining three people were treated with first aid at the scene. Forest department officials took the dead animal to Kishoreganj Thana that evening. Local forest ranger Monem Hossen formally identified the wild cat as a leopard and hinted that it may have crossed into Bangladesh from the Indian forests of Jalpaiguri or Kuchbihar districts.

Villagers beat leopard to death

7 injured

Villagers beat a leopard to death yesterday after it attacked seven people at Bagdanga village in Kurigram. Police said the wild cat attacked Serajul Islam, 45, while he was working at a paddy field in the morning. When he screamed for help, villagers rushed to the spot and chased the leopard that later jumped into a nearby water body. On information, policemen from Nageswari Police Station rushed to the spot. The villagers asked the policemen to shoot the wild cat but they refused to do so. Later, the villagers beat the leopard to death at around 10:00am. Injured Serajul, Azahar Ali, 27, Rejaul Karim Reza, 30, Nurunnabi, 40, Mozibar Rahman, 35, Ashraf Ali, 40, and Azizur Rahman were admitted to the Nageswari Upazila Health Complex. Kurigram Police Super Mahabubur Rahman said they handed over the dead leopard to the forest department.

Leopard beaten to death

Villagers beat a leopard to death at Bangaon village under Ranishankoil upazila in Thakurgaon yesterday afternoon. Police and local people said the animal, coming out of its hiding from a wheat field, suddenly attacked and injured five people at about 3:00pm. The injured are Atub Ali, 37, Wahab Ali, 40, Abdur Razzak, 32, Ataur Rahaman, 32, and Azhar Ali, 26. Hearing their screams, villagers rushed to the spot and beat the leopard with iron rods, sticks and spears to death. Later, the locals hung it on a tree in the high school ground. On information, police rushed to the spot and brought the dead leopard to Ranishankoil Police Station. Officer in Charge of the police station told this correspondent that they informed the forest department to hand it over. The same leopard also injured another five people at Basnahar village of Ranishankoil upazila on Sunday evening.

3 injured in leopard attack

Three people were injured when a stray leopard pounced on them at Mohammadpur village in Patgram upazila of Lalmonirhat yesterday, five days after the villagers killed another leopard that mauled 12 people. The villagers spotted the wild cat in a paddy field in the morning and informed the law enforcers, Upazila Nirbahi Officer Harunur Rashid told The Daily Star. As the villagers surrounded it before police reached the spot, the leopard attacked them, leaving Santosh Roy, 35, Sunil Roy, 32, and Nazimuddin, 40, injured. They were admitted to Patgram Upazila Health Complex. Police and Border Guard Bangladesh personnel had been trying to catch the leopard till filing of this report last night.

Villagers beat a leopard to death at the border village of Daluapara under Boda upazila in Panchagarh yesterday. Police and local people said the animal appeared in a wheat field around 9:00 am. Hearing the news, thousands of villagers gathered to encircle the leopard. Wildlife experts say leopards, one of the rare carnivore, are already facing extinction in Bangladesh. "There might be a very few living in the Chittagong Hill Tracts," Ali Kabir, Divisional Forest Officer of Dinajpur, told The Daily Star last night over telephone.

Leopard beaten to death

A leopard was beaten to death at Daulatpur village in Boda upazila of Panchagarh on Saturday evening in presence of police and forest officials.

Locals said a leopard appeared at around 11:30am at Bosuniapara village and took shelter in a ditch beside a water body covered with kalmi trees. Thousands of villagers gathered to encircle the leopard.

Locals believe the leopard entered the village from forests beyond Bangladesh territory.

Local police and civil administration and forest officials were informed about the matter.

Boda Police Station Officer-in-Charge (OC) Abu Haydar Md Ashrafuzzaman told this correspondent that thousands of villagers encircled the animal in the village.

After magrib prayers, the leopard came out from the ditch and ran towards the villagers.

Fearing attack by the animal, villagers beat it to death.

The OC said a team of police was deployed there from afternoon. They asked the villagers to keep themselves at a safe distance.

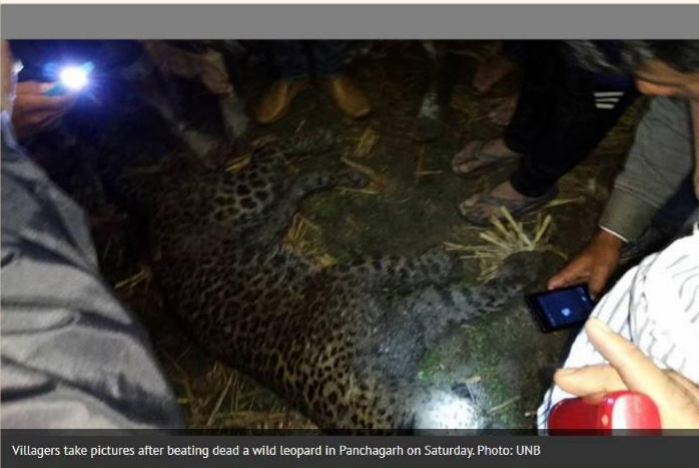
The dead leopard was handed over to the local forest officer.

Dinajpur Divisional Forest Officer Abdur Rahman said they informed the expert for animal rescue of Wildlife Management and Nature Conservation Department.

The leopard was 50 inches long, 28 inches high, with 29 inches chest and 19 inches neck, officials said.

Leopard beaten to death in Sherpur after injuring one

Villagers beat a leopard to death after it attacked the mayor of Sribordi municipality at Shait Kakra village in Sribordi upazila of Sherpur today.

According to the witnesses, the leopard entered the village from forests in the morning. As local people chased the animal it took shelter in a hole made for shallow engine.

At one stage, when Mayor Abu Syed, 29, along with some local people went there the leopard swooped on him, leaving him critically injured.

He received severe injuries as the animal tore off his ear and flesh from the forehead. Later, he was rushed to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital.

Meanwhile, local people caught the leopard and beat it to death with sticks.

S Alam, officer-in-charge of Sribordi Police Station, said the body of the tiger was kept at the Upazila Parishad premises.

Rezaul Karim, assistant forest preservation of Sherpur, formally identified the eight feet long animal as a leopard and hinted that it may have crossed into Bangladesh from the Indian forests.

Police today rescued four cubs of lion and leopard from a Prado jeep in Jessore Sadar upazila.

The cubs – two of lion and two of leopard – were being taken from Dhaka's Uttara to Benapole by the jeep (Dhaka Metro-Gha 13-2790) illegally, said Syed Bayejid Hossain, in-charge of Chansra police camp.

On a tip off, the camp police challenged the vehicle at Chansra intersection around 10:10 am and rescued the cubs, the police official told our Benapole correspondent.

The law enforcers also detained two people, Rana Eshuayan, 27, of Narsingdi and Kamruzzaman Babu, 30, of Bogra, in this connection, he said, adding that they are being interrogated for further information.

Law enforcers detained two persons and recovered two leopard cubs from their possessions in Narayanganj Sadar upazila today.

The detainees were identified as Showkat Islam Mithu, 40, and his associate Ariful Islam, 28, Rab said.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of Rab-11 led by Major Ashik Billah conducted a drive at Showkat's house in Fatullah area and detained the duo for possessing the cubs illegally, the Rab official said.

The two cubs were brought from Africa around five or six days ago, Major Ashik Billah said.

The poachers were planning to smuggle the cubs out to a nearby country, he said quoting the detainees.

232 wild animal hides seized in Dhaka; 2 jailed

A mobile court of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) today seized 232 hides of different wild animals including leopard and fishing cat from a shop in Paribagh area of Dhaka.

The mobile court led by Rab's Executive Magistrate Sarwoer Alam also seized 55 products made by the animal hides from the shop Crafts Corner in the DIT Super market and sentenced two brothers, owners of the shop, one-year imprisonment each for selling hides.

The hides include one leopard, one fishing cat, two monkeys, 227 monitor lizards and a wild cat while the products include two money bags and 21 bags made by snake hide, and 32 bags made by deer hide.

The court also fined the shop owners Tk 50,000 each, in default, they will have to suffer one more month in jail, said Sarwoer Alam, who led the drive.

Talking to The Daily Star, Sarwoer Alam said the shop owners collected the hides and products from brokers and poachers for selling.

The market price of one leopard is Tk 30 lakh, he said.
